MAIL-IN VOTING

SEPTEMBER 16 – OCTOBER 27, 2024

1 Vote by Mail

2 Votes Cast

3 Secure Ballots

Safeguards and Requirements

- Proof of identity required when requesting ballots
- Voters can track their ballots on state websites
- Updated voting lists prevent people from voting by mail and in-person
- Deadlines vary for mail-in voting (received by Election Day or postmarked by a specific date)

EARLY VOTING& ELECTION DAY

THROUGH NOVEMBER 5, 2024

- 1 Voting Machine Setup
- 2 Qualify & Assist Voters
- 3 Votes Cast
- Independent Observation

Safeguards and Requirements

- Beginning date ranges from September 20 (MN, SD, VA) to October 31 (KY)
- End dates range from October 29 (LA, PA) to November 5 (AK, CA, CO, HI, WA)
- Some states utilize in-person voting locations for early voting, others conduct it exclusively by mail
- Early voting became more widespread in 2020



Guardrails across states

- 95% of voters are in jurisdictions that use paper ballots or have paper backups.
- Bipartisan networks of poll workers everyday people from the community - administer our elections.
- Election equipment goes through a competitive bidding process, certification, and public testing.
- Each state has rules for recounting and auditing the results.

- Safeguards are in place to prevent people from voting both in-person and by mail -- and to ensure that only eligible voters cast ballots.
- 4 Make your plan to vote, including tracking your mail-in ballot online
