MISSION STATEMENT



Key Messages Throughout the Process

- 1.Promote peace, calm, and patience
- **2.Call** for every eligible voter to be able to cast their ballot, and for every vote to be counted
- **3.Provide** nonpartisan, accurate information to your network
- **4.Set expectations** about potential challenges and delays in the electoral process

MAIL-IN VOTING

SEPTEMBER 16 – OCTOBER 27, 2024



2 Votes Cast

3 Secure Ballots

Safeguards and Requirements

- Proof of identity typically required to ballot
- Ballot tracking is available in many jurisdictions.
- Updated voting lists prevent people from voting by mail and in-person
- Deadlines vary for mail-in voting (received be Election Day or postmarked by a specific date), USPS recommends getting ballots in one week before they are due.

EARLY VOTING & ELECTION DAY

THROUGH NOVEMBER 5, 2024

- 1 Voting Machine Setup
- 2 Qualify & Assist Voters
- 3 Votes Cast
- 4 Independent Observation

Safeguards and Requirements

- Some states utilize in-person voting location for early voting, others conduct it exclusively by mail
- Staffed by a bipartisan network of poll workers
- Many aspects open to public or observers
- Results are not "official" when they are "called"

EARLY VOTING & ELECTION DAY

Potential Developments









Mistakes or technical issues Red mirage/Blue shift (and Intimidation at polling places the reverse)

Severe weather

Premature claims of victory Threats to election workers

Eligibility challenges

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Mass record requests

Share accurate information (Vote411.org) and go to local election officials and SOS.

RESULTS COUNT, CHECK, CANVASS, CERTIFICATION

NOVEMBER 5 – DECEMBER 11, 2024

- 1 Canvass & Tabulation
- 2 Audits Recount if results are challenged
- 3 County Certification
- 4 State Certification
- 5 Transmit Certificates

Safeguards and Requirements

- States take time to get the count right -- so well likely will not know the winner on Election
 Night
- Recounts available within certain margins (automatic or requested)
- Audited results verify machine tabulation
- Results are often checked at the precinct, the county, and by the state.

COUNT, CHECK, CANVASS, CERTIFICATION

INTERFERENCE
Blocking results, preventing ballot access, refusal to enforce election laws

Drawn out process vs. ECRA deadline

What you can do



Educate your network: We likely will not know the results on Election Night.



Encourage officials to count every vote



Urge calm, patience, and trust in the process

Assessment on security & violence



Our elections are safe & secure.
Voters can have confidence that
they will be able to cast their ballot
safely and it will be counted



Experts are not overly concerned about violence on election day, though threats may occur.



Experts are concerned about potential threats to officials who have roles in the post-election process and potential violence during the post-election period more broadly.
